

COMMUNITY GRANT REVIEW PROCESS

First, a minimum of three review panel members score each application that has successfully completed the **compliance review**.

Next, the **review panel** reviews, scores, and ranks the applications, and meets to determine the slate of programs to present to the Komen Michigan Board of Directors.

Then, the Board of Directors votes to approve the **grants slate** or declines the slate, which then will require the review panel to reconvene.

Finally, programs are funded in order of the grants slate until all board-approved funding has been expended.



COMMUNITY GRANT SCORING CRITERIA:

- 1) IMPACT
- 2) STATEMENT OF NEED
- 3) PROJECT DESIGN
- 4) ORGANIZATION CAPACITY
- 5) MONITORING AND EVALUATION
- 6) COLLABORATION OF COMMUNITY PARTNERS
- 7) SUSTAINABILITY

PLEASE NOTE:

Grants are reviewed by a Grants Review Panel made up of volunteers from the community.

Our goal is to fund the most impactful programs – not the most programs.

Komen Michigan Staff and Board members are not involved in the scoring and ranking of applications.

Funding is not guaranteed year over year – each year is a clean slate.

DEFINITIONS:

Compliance Review

An administrative review of each grant application to ensure an application meets all criteria laid out in the RFA.

Review Panel

A diverse group of experts & community representatives who has been recruited by the affiliate.

Grants Slate

The ranked list of applications which determines the order of funding.
